

Peaslake Free School Catch up Funding

In June 2020 the Government announced a £1 billion fund for education, the guidance (https://www.gov.uk/guidance/coronavirus-covid-19-catch-up-premium) shows that the money is split between a catch-up premium and a national tutoring scheme.

The catch up premium is funded on a per pupil basis at £80 per pupil. How the money is allocated will be down to schools, based on the needs of their pupils. To support schools to make the best use of this funding, the Education Endowment Foundation has published a support guide with evidence-based approaches to catch up for all children. At Peaslake Free School we will make targeted use of the catch up funding to raise the progress and attainment of all pupils to close the gap created as a result of the Covid-19 closures.
